Recipe Love Soup

Ingredients:

- ¹/₃ cup beef bouillon granules
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- ¹/₄ cup onion flakes or 1 medium <u>onion</u>,
 sautéed
- ¹/₄ cup <u>barley</u>
- ¹/₂ cup <u>rice</u>
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup dry pasta, of your choice (macaroni or alphabets etc.)
- 1 (16 ounce) can <u>diced tomatoes</u>

Directions:

- 1) Soak 1/3 cup of split peas and 1/2 cup of lentils overnight.
- 2) In a 5 quart kettle, brown 1 lb. chopped meat and drain.
- 3) Add remaining ingredients, plus the split peas and lentils (except the pasta) plus 12 cups of water.
- 4) Heat to a boil, stirring occasionally.
- 5) Reduce heat to a simmer for 30 minutes.
- 6) Add pasta and simmer for 15 minutes more.
- *** Note: This recipe freezes well using quart sized jars (don't forget to leave enough room for expansion. When reheating add a little water. This is a very hearty soup.

BC has a new Anti-Bullying Legislation. Effective July 1st, 2012, Worksafe BC will be accepting claims for mental distress based on workplace bullying and harassment.

Bullying means aggressive, abusive, or hostile conduct, humiliation, intimidation, or threats which could be considered be a reasonable person to create a negative impact on any Personnel, or produce an environment detrimental to work for any Personnel.

Chief & council passed a Bullying Policy at their April 10, 2012 council meeting.


