

What NOT to Put Down the toilet (or drain) when on a Septic System

Your plumbing is tough—but flushing or draining the wrong things, can clog pipes and septic systems. Here's what to never send down the drain:

Never flush:

- Wet wipes (even "flushable" ones!)
- Feminine hygiene products
- · Paper towels or tissues
- Dental floss
- Cotton swabs, balls, or pads
- Hair
- Diapers
- Medication
- · Grease, oil, or fat (they harden and clog)
- Coffee grounds
- Food scraps
- Eggshells
- Paint, chemicals, or solvent
- Harsh drain cleaners (they can corrode pipes)

Pick the Right Style of Laundry and Dishwasher Detergent:

- Liquid detergent is the best option for septic systems. It can also be used effectively
 in nearly any water condition.
- Do not use laundry pods or powdered detergent, as they tend to clog septic systems because they don't always dissolve completely in the washer. Over time, this buildup can lead to plumbing blockages.
